Welcome to this brief training session: <u>Evangelism</u> Health Check & Equipping to Share the Gospel!

We have a few goals:

First - to invite reflection, assessment, and candid conversations among ourselves and within churches, regarding the ministry of evangelism;

Second - that we'll desire to become channels of God's grace to those who don't yet know the Lord: seeking to engage people in spiritual conversations, able to share our testimony and the gospel of Jesus Christ in ways that brings others to life-giving faith.

Third - that we'll begin to "spur one another on" ... promoting a culture of evangelism within our congregations - that we'll become disciples who make disciples, who make disciples!

Our Vision: Through the empowerment of the Holy Spirit, the Global Methodist Church envisions **multiplying disciples** of Jesus Christ throughout the earth who *flourish* in scriptural holiness as we <u>worship passionately</u>, <u>love extravagantly</u>, and **witness boldly.**

What we're saying is, a commitment to "evangelism" (sharing the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ), is baked right into our identity!

< Perhaps you have memories of a key person in your life that opened God's Word to you and really helped you to understand who God is - and help you come to know Him.

All of these are significant channels for sharing the gospel and bringing people to faith in Christ!

Let's take a moment to consider some of the Scriptural foundations for the ministry of evangelism - (these are found on p. 1 of your handout...)

"Now, brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain.

For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: **that Christ died for our sins** according to the Scriptures, **that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day** according to the Scriptures..." (1 Cor. 15:1-4)

Because of God's love, Christ's sacrifice, and the Holy Spirit's power - we've received new life, a new identity, and new calling, and the capacity to be His witnesses. Not 'hiding our light under a bushel' - we are to declare His praises to the world!


<< We're going to take a few minutes here: (minutes). After you've answered your questions, use the time to discuss with someone next to you any thoughts or observations that come to mind.

"Some of you may be totally thrilled after responding to the 'Health Check' questions. For example: Your church is 'on fire' - faithful and fruitful in sharing the gospel and making disciples, and you're warmly recalling the joy of recently leading someone to faith in Christ.

Or, you might be thinking, 'Hmmmm...we need a tune-up... to stir up the gifts that are in us, get equipped and get sharing!'

Perhaps some might be feeling a hint of anxiety or dread: 'Oh my goodness! - I've never shared the gospel...!'




"If you're feeling at all uncomfortable at the thought of sharing your faith, you're NOT alone."

Take a look at this statistic that was Lifeway Research posted in 2022:

"7 out of 10 American Christians Don't Know How to Share Their Faith."

It makes sense why a lot of believers would feel uncomfortable talking about faith, right??!



<< "But now look at another interesting finding..."

"9 out of 10 Americans are at *Least*Somewhat Open
to Having a Conversation with a Friend
about Jesus."

Did you imagine that?!

I'm taking this to mean that there are people you know or come across, that are ready **for you** to start the conversation!

NOW if you're a member of a church, and not a pastor, you might be thinking, "Well that's for pastors to do - they're the 'religious *professionals,*" - Right? :):)

<< While not everyone has gifted to "BE" an evangelist, every believer needs to be equipped to share the gospel, and to share their testimony of salvation and God's grace in their lives. And God has a plan for that! [READ Eph.4:11-13] The church needs everybody to be equipped - so that the church will be built up, and become mature!</p>

How else will we live out our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ and spreading scriptural holiness across the globe? How else will we become a church that worships passionately, loves extravagantly, and witnesses boldly?



<< As Methodists, we affirm the responsibility of pastors to be equippers, like described in Ephesians 4.

We also see the deep commitment to evangelism within the ministry of Methodist pastors:

(We see it in Wesley's Historic Questions of Traveling Preachers... 'Do they clearly understand salvation by faith - and do they communicate God's truths well?

For Elders - Questions about diligently instructing shildren and visiting from boung to


For Elders - Questions about diligently instructing children and visiting from house to house' - these are part of our DNA! Communicating the need for Christ and how to receive forgiveness and new life in Jesus is **the core message** to be shared!

<< S: "Pastors - let's read one of Wesley's classic instructions to preachers":

(After reading... "Pastors, if you're hearing this and thinking, 'But Wesley doesn't understand all that I have to do each week, and everything my church expects...," take heart! Let's simplify this:

We need to be honest about what is "busy work", what is "good and important to do", and what is ESSENTIAL to our calling.

People facing eternity without Christ -- this is what should keep us up at night, not the other stuff!



<< So let's step back for a moment. What does it look like to be pastors & churches that are <u>COMMITTED</u> to Evangelism? (Creating a 'culture of evangelism?) (We can 'look at the fruit' to know if we are. What elements go into producing this beautiful fruit?)

- 1 **Regularly share the gospel** visitation with families; 1:1; new member classes;
- 2 Equipping is happening. (If you're thinking, 'Yes, we did evangelism training (Evangelism Explosion, or Contagious Christian) 5 years ago' and haven't since then, that's too long ago It's time for a refresh! This is an ongoing equipping need! Pastors, evangelism team, class leaders, are you taking out individuals, mentoring in faithsharing? Do you have a strategy for reaching your community with the gospel?
- 3. **Preach** the necessity of Christ for salvation; 4. **Invite** people to become disciples (opp'ty to <u>respond</u>); 5. **Providing opp'ties for exploring faith (EX: Alpha)?**

SLIDE 19 "Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." (John 6:35) "Evangelism is just one beggar telling another beggar where to find bread." - D.T. Niles, Ceylon Methodist Conference

<< When we're equipping members of the church for evangelism, building & promoting a 'culture of evangelism' - we can be mindful of what D.T. Niles, a pastor and evangelist of the Ceylon ("Suh-laan", Indosia) Methodist Conference once said:

"Evangelism is just one <u>beggar</u> telling another beggar where to find bread."

Those who are humble, and who've been equipped to evangelize, can find incredible joy helping people find **JESUS**, the BREAD of LIFE!

<< Would you turn to page 2 in your handout?)

When we think of sharing the gospel, it's helpful to have a framework for thinking about life and our relationship with God "with a Big Picture" view.

What you see on the top of page 2 is what we often think of as "God's Story: His Love for Humanity" and we have it divided up into 4 "chapters."

If you're at all new to Christianity, or have ever felt overwhelmed by the Bible ("how does it all fit together?!) this provides a brief summary that ties things together. If somebody asks you, "What does Christianity teach?" this is a place you can start with to explain. We're just going to touch on each of these 'chapters':

<< The first chapter is how everything started: With God, our Creator, making all things GOOD.:)

You can read some of the passages that support this, and how we as humans, made in the IMAGE of God, 'fit into the story.'

That first chapter of God's Story, is of course, CREATION.

II. How everything broke:

SIN

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(THE FALL)

<< Chapter 2: "How everything broke", when SIN entered into our human family.

And it didn't stop with Adam and Eve. It is part of OUR Nature. And it's in Every. One. of US!

SIN is not just a 'wrong deed' that makes us feel guilty afterwards. SIN is something that 'runs deep' within us - it is a type of rebellion that has become, "Part of our Nature." - (if you've ever seen a 2 year old react when they're told 'NO', you understand!)

When SIN entered the family, the beautiful relationship with God broke too.

This Chapter, is identified as "The FALL."

(CREATION) SLIDE 23

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God's Story: His Love for Humanity

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'Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12)

(REDEMPTION)

<< Left on our own, we're helpless! Sinners standing before Holy God, separated and without hope. Unable to please God, and powerless to do so if

wanted to!

As we see in Scriptures - God's Word to us, the Bible - if we remain in this state, it has eternal consequences too.

As uncomfortable as it might make us feel, Jesus did teach & give warnings about hell, and the pain of eternal separation from God.

But in this 3d Chapter:), we see the extent of God's love & His plan for our rescue: deeply sacrificial, JESUS - giving His life on the cross, to take on the penalty of our sins - in our place, the Righteous for the Unrighteous. No matter where we've been or what we've done, or, no matter how good we've thought we are - God extends His grace and mercy to those who repent and trust Christ, who is both Savior and Lord. This is REDEMPTION; an essential part of Christian faith - foundational to becoming a 'disciple' of Jesus.

(CREATION) (THE FALL)

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"And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit." (2 Cor. 3:18)

"Behold, I am making all things new." (Rev. 21:5)

(RESTORATION)

<< The final chapter is incredibly exciting! God's work of RE-CREATION - both now and in heaven.

This is the work of the Holy Spirit within the life of believers: SANCTIFICATION - Empowering us to become 'more and more like Jesus' - renewing our minds, changing our thoughts, feelings, speech, actions, will - our capacity to love God and love others....

THIS IS RESTORATION - The Broken Image of God within us being Made New!

God's Story: His Love for Humanity in Four Chapters

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(RESTORATION)

< As we consider God's Story, if we take a moment to look back over our life, I'm pretty sure we **see ourselves** in this story too! (Ideally, give folks a few minutes to think about their own stories, and how they see God at work in their lives.)

We see ourselves in this story too...



<< We won't linger at this time over this chart that is also on page **2** of your handout, but I encourage you to review it, and consider the relationships that are included, and the changes that come about as a result of the Fall. (We're *more than* familiar with these characteristics or qualities!)

As you reflect upon the nature of those relationships if lived out "As God Intended", you'll also be reminded of the changes in our relationships that can come about as God RESTORES us through His SANCTIFY-ING GRACE.

The Holy Spirit working in us enables us to move out of Genesis 3 living, to what God intended - Genesis 1 & 2 'made in the image of God' beautiful lives.




<< This really is at the heart of the "Wesleyan Way of Salvation."

You see, Evangelism isn't simply about "getting someone **converted**"...

Evangelism helps people understand there's an open door to *a life* of restorative, healing connection with God -

A life of 'belonging' ... becoming a Child of God - with hope; peace that overcomes anxiety, and confidence to face the future, that can **only** come to those who are in Christ.

Then He said to them all:

'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me.



For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will save it. What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, and yet lose or forfeit their very self?

Whoever is ashamed of me and my words, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his glory and in the glory of the Father and of the holy angels." (Luke 9:23-26)

<< As you look at page 3 in your handout, you'll see visual laying out the "Wesleyan Way of Salvation." The chart on the bottom provides Scriptures for you to explore and use for reference.</p>
Today, because our time is short, we'll just touch on a couple of points along the salvation continuum that we recognize as Wesleyan Christians:

1st: The emphasis upon GRACE. From before we ever came to be followers of Jesus, God was pouring out grace upon us - helping us recognize our spiritual state and our need for forgiveness and salvation through Christ.

2nd: "Repentance" That initial repentance - between 'Conviction of Sin' & 'Conversion' is the repentance that "leads to salvation." We're dependent upon God's grace to take this essential step into the life of faith. And it's God's grace that assists us in the sanctification process.

When we talk about evangelism - the "end goal" is not mere 'conversion' or 'getting saved'. We're inviting people to become <u>disciples</u> - experiencing new life in Christ, being led, sanctified, so we will become people who reflect Jesus' heart, mind, and love in our thoughts, words & actions - bringing the light of Christ to the world.

<< Now let's switch gears. You've probably seen the Christian 'fish' or "ICHTHUS" image before. You might even have a decal of it sticking to your car. In Greek, the letters spelling ICHTHUS represented the first letters of "Jesus, Christ, God's Son, Savior." History has it that this symbol was used by early Christians during an era of intense persecution. When acknowledging one's faith could lead to death. A believer talking with a stranger would casually scrape a curved line in the dirt. If the other person drew a line that 'completed the fish' it was understood that both were believers.

Most of us from the west have never faced that level of risk or danger sharing about our faith in Jesus. (Although we know that in parts of the world, this level of danger is very real. And yet, our brothers and sisters *hold firm*.)

<< Let's stand and read LUKE 9:23-26 together.

(Thank you; you can be seated.) Do you hear how these verses "go together"? Disciples...Deny self. (Self-interests; self-preservation). Taking up our cross - daily. Following Jesus - regardless of the risk of loss. Not ashamed to be one of Jesus' or of His words. (Willing to risk shame, humiliation, even the risk of death. Wow!)

<< Let's turn to page 4 in our handouts. If you've ever found yourself feeling reluctant to share your testimony or the gospel, read through the 'check-list' on the left-hand side of the page. (There's a picture of what you're looking for, here on the screen.)

Take a moment to 'check' any of the reasons that have held you back.

[S: Provide a few minutes; if there is time: "Turn to your neighbor and share the reason that most impacts you - that has 'kept you si-

lent."]

[S: Luke 6:22-23 Blessed are you when people hate you, when they exclude you and insult you and reject your name as evil, because of the Son of Man. "Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, because great is your reward in heaven. For that is how their ancestors treated the prophets. 1

<< We're not taking a poll, but I'm guessing there may be a few reasons that 'show up' frequently on our lists.

Often, we're concerned about how others will perceive us. How they'll think of us. And perhaps, how that might impact our relationships in the future. Usually, this is rooted in fear.

Fear we'll be misunderstood, blamed, judged.

We need to remind ourselves, this fear is not of God. [S: (2 Tim. 1:7)]

Responding to "Don't Judge Me"

The truth?

"For **all** have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

"As it is written, "**There is** no one righteous, not even one." (Romans 3:10)

(Our own words will judge us - Matthew 12:36-37.)

Given this spiritual reality, we can gently communicate we're all in the same situation! The enemy is very happy if we're paralyzed and silent! We need to be aware that people who are captive to Satan may be the first to repeat the meme, "Don't Judge me." If you're reluctant to speak about the Lord because you're afraid someone will think you're judgmental - remember the Truth:

- "**ALL** have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.
- There is *no one* who is righteous; not even one!
- Given this spiritual reality we can gently communicate - we're all in the same situation!>>>

REPENTANCE? (It's for all of us!)

"... Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matt. 4:17).

"Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death." (2 Cor. 7:10).



"Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord." (Acts 3:19)

<< ...and that repentance is for all of us! If we're passing this truth along to others, we can let them know that the call to repentance was part of Jesus' first recorded message...:) (His words, not ours....):)

We could say that our **repentance** (turning to God, confessing our sins, asking His forgiveness, seeking to follow His way and not our own) is what God is waiting for...

While we are slow to admit our sins and failings, God is like the father waiting for the prodigal son to return - so He can restore us!

The Lord desires to cleanse and renew us!



"After that, He poured water into a basin and began to wash His disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around Him.

He came to Simon Peter, who said to Him, 'Lord, are you going to wash **my** feet?" (John 13:5-6)

<< We don't need to be afraid of push-back if our heart -posture is right:

When we're sharing our testimony or God's story, we want to share from the place of remembering what it means personally, to be the recipient of God's forgiveness; God's grace.

Think about a time when you participated in a foot washing service. What is it like? Slightly uncomfortable? ('?How many of you washed your feet first, before attending?':)) With our feet not too pretty and perhaps even smelly - yet another kneels before us to wash our feet and wipe them dry. Did it leave you feeling a bit humble? Yet a bit in awe; grateful?

This place of humility is the perfect heart-posture for sharing about the love of Christ.:):)

for Sharing the Gospel Which Most Deeply Impact Your Heart?

- Love for Christ (He is so good and has changed my life...I'm so grateful, I have to tell people about Him!)
- The love of Christ compels me! (2 Cor. 5:14; 1 John 4:20)
- Like Jesus, we are moved with compassion on behalf of others (Matt. 9:36, 15:32; Luke 15:20; Mark 1:41)
- Promised rewards /rewards in heaven (Matt.19:27-30) Avoiding 'blood-guilt' (Ezekiel 33:6; Acts 20:26)
- (We don't want to face God and have to explain why we didn't share the gospel with family, friends & neighbors)
- pedience to Jesus: to be His witnesses & make disciples (Mk 1:17-18, 2:14; Mt. 28:19-20; John 14:15, 21)
- To bear much fruit & bring glory to God (John 17:4; John 15:7-8; Psalm 96:8-13; Gal. 1:10; Ps.9:1)
- he desire to have our life count for eternal purposes (Matthew 16:26; 1 Peter 1:24-25)
- So that people will be saved (John 3:16-18; Rom 10:17)
- I have family members and friends who don't kno Jesus as their Lord and Savior (Luke 16:19-31)
- secause of the reality of hell eternal suffering and separation from God (We need to warn and help peop avoid this!) (Mark 9:43-48; Mt. 13:49-50, Mt.25:1-46)
- know people who struggle with anxiety, depression and are living without hope... (Prov. 18:24; Heb. 6:19; 1 Pet. 3:15; John 4:13-14
- The Holy Spirit empowers witnesses (how exciting!) and strengthens believers (Acts 1:8; Eph. 3:16; 1 Cor. 12:11)
- God wants to work through us to accomplish His purposes (Eph.2:8·10); I want to please Him (1 Thes. 2:4)
- So others will know Jesus: the Way, Truth, & Life! (John 14:6)

While we used to joke about stopping for directions before GPS was available, we know that being **lost** can be a real dilemma.

Being spiritually **lost is also real, unsettling;** and dangerous.

To the extent that God Himself goes out looking for us!

Being found is really great!

To the extent that it leads to celebrations and joy!

"When He saw the crowds, **He had compassion on them**, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest field." (Matthew 9:36-38)

Think about today's world. If you're aware of recent events among young adults - (think 'the most recent Asbury revival', and the revivals that are taking place across many colleges/ universities) - you Know That God Is Moving among Young Adults.

That **He is Doing a Work** of Binding Wounds, Healing Hearts, and Setting People Free.



This same motivation can move us into starting spiritual conversations. (As a worker in the harvest, empowered by the Holy Spirit, **all of the MOTIVATORS are** *MUCH* **STRONGER than any** of the factors that in the *past* may have made us Reluctant to share the Good News!

Starting Spiritual Conversations

Before sharing the gospel with someone, ask God for discernment, and to fill your heart with compassion for those who don't need Jesus. Keep the love of Christ prominent in your sharing.





< If you've never had the joy of leading someone to Christ, the idea of Starting Spirtual Conversations might seem daunting. :)

But we don't need to be a rocket scientist; we don't need to be people who've memorized a bunch of scripts or talking points to "convince" people.

We do want to pray. To ask God to lead us; give us discernment, and fill us with compassion; love.



Here are 10 questions you might find helpful to advance genuine spiritual conversations with those who do not share your worldview:

- Do you have a background in religion? If so, what is it?
 Was there ever a time you believed in God? If so, why did you think it changed?
- How important is spirituality to your life now? Has this changed over time? If so, why?
- In terms of religion, who has had the biggest influence on your life?
- Who do you think Jesus was, and why?
- 6. Are there any features of the world that give you
- pause and make you think there might be a God?
 7. Are there any things that attract you to religion in general or Christianity in particular? And are there
- any things that turn you away?

 8. What experiences have most shaped your spiritual
- If you were to breakdown the key reasons you don't believe into intellectual, emotional, personal or other factors, how would you rate them?
- 10. What might convince you to believe in God?

The good news for these kinds of conversations is that you don't have to have all the answers. That's right. You don't have to be an expert! You just need to be bold enough to ask the questions and care enough to listen. If you do, you might be amazed at the depth of conversation you can have with people who hold radically different views than your own.

While many of us in the west were raised in 'Guilt-Innocence' culture, Honor-Shame culture is growing, and there are others whose lives are driven by more by the needs of Fear-Power.</p>

In reality, people probably are a mix - but lean more into one than another.

In the end, though, the gospel of Jesus - meets the needs of ALL people - everywhere! :)

<< There may be times when we won't want to take a lot of time in a conversation sharing deeply about our own story we want to give a glimpse, a summary - because we're trying to discover whether the persons we're talking with knows Jesus...

You see the 3 steps, and there's space below for you to 'fill in' your own responses.

- "There was a time in my life when I was..."
- "Now, I am.... and...." (How your life is different).
- "Do you have a story like that?"

(If you've "always been in church" (which is **great** testimony!) you might want to consider: has there ever been a time when the Lord 'brought you home',

- -or- did He reveal something that needed to change in your life and you really needed His help?


